Governor Abbott issued a Statewide Executive Order that will go into effect this Friday March 20, 2020 at midnight and will last thru Friday, April 3, 2020 at midnight. These dates above are subject to change.

Governor Abbot's Statewide Executive Order:

1. Every person in Texas must avoid social gatherings that have more than 10 people.
2. People should avoid eating and drinking at bars, restaurants and food courts or visiting gyms. There will be no dining at bars or restaurant dining rooms since they will be closed. Restaurants can still offer take-out options.
3. People shall not visit nursing homes, retirement centers or long-term facilities unless they're providing critical care assistance.
4. All Texas schools must close temporarily. This does not mean that education stops. Superintendents will continue to work with the Texas Education Agency to continue online or additional educational options.


For offices and workplaces that remain open, employees are encouraged to practice good hygiene and work from home if possible.

Martin County will follow this Statewide Executive Order and ask all citizens in Martin County to comply. This order is not a shelter in place Order. Citizens may go to the grocery stores, banks, gas stations and parks.

Martin County is continuing to monitor COVID-19 and will keep the public notified as changes occur.

Currently, there are no confirmed COVID-19 cases in Martin County. Therefore, Martin County is not declaring a Public Health Disaster at this time, but we will adhere to the State's Executive Order.
